

## PE and Sports Funding

2017/2018

### Additional Funding

The school received £8,562 PE and sport funding in 2017/2018. This enables the school to develop and enhance the provision for children in a range of ways.

The total spend for 2017-2018 was £4089,85. The surplus of £4473 has been carried forward for use in the Summer Term 2018, along with the additional funding received in October 2017 to enable to school to invest in playground development during 2018/2019. Funding for 2018/2019 therefore totals £21183.
